Property Relief

Landfill host fees allow us to offer Property Relief to you. Look closely at the enclosed tax bill under the column for "Taxing Jurisdiction". You'll see that Kekoskee has a minus sign in front of the amount in the "Net Tax" column. That amount is SUBTRACTED from the other taxes listed! The amount fluctuates from year-to-year according to how much money is set aside, how many parcels there are, and what the current mill rate (rate per \$1,000 of property value) is. ENJOY!

As in the past, you may also mail your tax payment to: Cindy Fredrick, W2862 Hwy TW, Mayville, WI 53050. We do NOT have credit card options. You need to send a check or ETF to our account BY January 31, 2021 to have it applied to the tax bill. REMEMBER to ALWAYS send your July payments to the Dodge County Treasurer to avoid the penalty for being late on your payment. July's payment CAN use the credit card option.

# REMEMBER your furry friends and license your Dogs

It is a state law! Your dogs must be licensed with a current rabies certificate EACH year. Unlicensed stray dogs cost about \$200 to get back!

Take care of it when you pay your taxes: Spayed or Neutered dog licenses are \$3.00. Unspayed or Unneutered dogs are \$8.00.

Late fee of \$10.00 will be enforced after April 1st. Please keep in mind that paying with the tax bill IS the best. You can even add it to the check along with your taxes!

## Yearly Reminders...

### **ATV/UTV Routes**

Safety FIRST! Check our website as well as Dodge County and local clubs for map information. The routes are designated with ATV/UTV signs. The Sheriff's Department will be policing the routes for the following conditions: carrying a valid motor vehicle license; max speed of 35 mph or the posted auto speed, whichever is lower; paved surfaces only; single file; between 5 am & midnight only; no driver under 16; no one under 18 without protective head gear. ### **Assessment info online**

A public (free) and a commercial (fee) site are now available through our website under Assessments.

### **Building Permits**

Please contact Rob Froh (Kunkel Engineering) @ 920-382-6202 if you have any doubts about whether you need a building permit. You don't need a permit to **REPLACE** a furnace, central air, water heater or other dwelling mechanical. You also don't need one to re-side, re-roof, install replacement windows, finish interior surfaces or install cabinetry in a dwelling. See our **Zoning Ordinance** for new buildings & additions.

### **Controlled Burns**

Residents should notify the Sheriff and/or your Fire chief for ANY controlled burns.

## **Ditch Burning**

Please REMOVE the plastic culvert markers BEFORE your ditch burn. After the burn, please RETURN them to their spot. "Damage to or destruction of a culvert marker that was installed by the Village shall...be subject to forfeitures" as stated in our Burning Ordinance.

### Fire Numbers

- ◆Rural fire numbers: please keep brush cut back. If your number is tipping, please reset it.
- ♦Lives may depend on it!

### Glacier Ridge Landfill

The Landfill will once again be awarding \$10,000 to seven area schools for environmental education. They also sponsor our Refuse & Recycling Site per agreement.

### **Junk Cars**

As stated in our ordinances, three or more unlicensed vehicles or unused/inoperable farm equipment pieces constitute a nuisance and a junk yard. If notified and the situation continues, penalties of up to \$500/day can accrue.

### **Land Notification**

You can get email alerts about a person or parcel when real estate activity takes place. Sign up for this FREE Dodge County service at https://landshark.co.dodge.wi.us/lns.app/

### **Refuse & Recycling Site**

FREE services from the landfill are only available at **OUR** Hwy V site. More information can be found on the back of this newsletter. You do NOT need a permit. All materials except liquids are accepted. We ask that you recycle as much as possible, but please **do NOT use plastic bags** for your recyclables. Every ounce kept out of the landfill saves Kekoskee money and helps Mother Earth!

## **Sanitary Late Fees**

For those users of the Kekoskee Sanitary system, a reminder that quarterly late fees are \$45 a quarter PLUS a 10% charge if your bill must be collected through a year-end tax special assessment.

## **Scholarships**

Two \$1,000 Kekoskee resident scholarships are awarded each year. 2020 recipients were Faith Danner & Amber Schraufnagel. See our website under Scholarships for more info.

## **Stray Animals**

Many animals now have chips implanted. Our Animal Control Officer has a reader. Please contact him or another Village officer if you spot a stray.

## <u>Fireworks Permits —</u> <u>for safety's sake...</u>

State law prohibits any person from possessing or using fireworks without a user's permit from the village president. A FREE permit application is available online. Permits aren't needed for sparklers, stationary cones and fountains, toy snakes, smoke bombs and caps, and noisemakers and confetti poppers with less than one-quarter grain of explosive mixture.

## Metal Detector Agreement

The Village was approached regarding permission to use a metal detector in our parks. After researching area norms regulating this hobby, we only ask that you notify us that you'll be using public space by signing an Agreement. You'll be asked to reapply every year and provide a copy of your drivers license the first time you apply. The Agreement can be found on our Permits & Licenses webpage.

## **Recreational Vehicle Regulation**

Enclosed with this newsletter is a copy of a proposed amendment to our Zoning Ordinance that will regulate "Recreational Vehicles for Temporary or Recreational Human Habitation". A public hearing on this amendment is being held on January 26, 2021 at 5:30 p.m. at the Hall, W3275 Hwy TW.

## Tax Notes:

### Make checks out to the Village of Kekoskee.

To get a **duplicate tax bill**: www.co.dodge.wi.gov > Land Information Search Tool > read conditions > "I Accept" button > enter your name (or other info) > "Search for Properties" button (lower left) > choose from the results at the bottom of the screen > top of screen, "Taxes" tab > upper left, choose **correct** "Tax Year" from dropdown > middle of screen, right, choose "Print Tax Bill" button.

Check your tax bills for your **Lottery Credit!** If this is your primary residence, you should see a lottery credit. If you do not, please notify Cindy Fredrick, Treasurer (387-4210), for a form to claim your credit. It must be your primary residence as of January 1st to qualify. And while you're checking out your tax bill, look for a **First Dollar Credit**, too. Every taxable parcel (business, commercial or private) containing a real property improvement (ex: building), qualifies for the First Dollar Credit. Unlike the Lottery and Gaming Credit, the property does not have to be the owner's primary residence. Contact Cindy, as listed above, if you don't see the credit. And so it goes... Since October 5, 2018, when the Village of Kekoskee attached all of the Town of Williamstown, we've been operating as a single entity: the Village of Kekoskee. We are in litigation to protect that status and, per a court judgement, will continue to operate as such for the foreseeable future. Remember, when registering your vehicle, to have the DOT change where the vehicle is kept to the Village of Kekoskee. # Are you a new resident or a current resident who has changed addresses within the Village?

You can register at any time! All you need is Proof of Residence (POR). See the box to the right for the website or call the Clerk to be emailed a form. Have a change of name? Use the same registration form.

### **Early Voting and Election Day**

ABSENTEE (mailed) ballots, must be requested in writing yearly. IN-PERSON early voting (also called absentee because you're "absent" on Election day) can start 14 days before each of the elections listed to the right. See the box above for CLERK contact info. Proof of Identification (POI) is required for Absentee, In-person AND Election

Day voting. Watch our website and the newspaper for the start/end of in-person early voting. ALL Kekoskee in-person absentee voting is done by appointment.

See our website . The site is for Kekoskee residents and landowners only.

♦ When reaching the top of the hill, proceed left and clockwise.

- ◆The <u>first LARGE bin</u>: metal scrap, appliances (fee for Freon), printers and computers (no monitors here). Fill from the BACK **first!** Ask for ASSISTANCE!
- Recycling bins: Food-grade glass & cans, plastics with a  $\Delta$ , aerosol cans and wire coat hangers can go together. Please wash cans & glass. All "clean" paper including window envelopes and phone books. → NO Plastic Bags ←→ Please flatten cardboard. ←

### ◆Miscellaneous:

- TVs & Monitors (fee) can be set aside on the ground.
- Tires (fee): set on the pile at the far end of the circle.
- Batteries go into the wire cage (ONLY larger batteries like auto, cycle, lawnmower & truck).
- For Wood & Compost: follow the drive behind the metal scrap dumpster to the burn pile
- ◆Garbage: (some fees for large items) back onto cement pad and toss down to dumpsters.
- ◆**Proof of Residency may be required.** Pay any fees at the site shack. A full fee list can be found on our website: http://kekoskee.com
- •Please pull to the side as a courtesy to others if not leaving when done.
